


From the Director:

I came across a little article the other day about Lent with some great ideas! When we ask each other what we're doing for Lent, we often reply that we're giving up a particular favorite item. Giving something up isn't a bad thing; it encourages self-discipline, is a form of fasting and penance, too. But we should also think about the possibility of doing something positive to strengthen our spiritual life; maybe increase our knowledge of our faith, look at the acts of mercy to see what we can do in our communities to spread the Good News. We're all called to do that!

So here are the 10 tips the article gave to make the season more meaningful:

- SLOW DOWN. Set aside 10 minutes for silent prayer or meditation to revive both body and spirit.
- READ A GOOD BOOK. Choose the life of a saint, a spiritual how-to, one of the pope's books, anything inspirational.
- BE KIND. Go out of your way to do something nice for someone every day.
- GET INVOLVED. Attend a Lenten lecture, maybe our parish mission.
- VOLUNTEER AT THE PARISH. Help clean or decorate the church, help with a ministry in the liturgy, anything!
- REACH OUT. Invite an inactive Catholic to come with you to Mass, or to one of the Lenten opportunities like Soup and Stations
- PRAY. Especially for people you don't like and for people who don't like you.
- TUNE OUT. Turn off the electronics and spend a night of quality time with your family or friends
- CLEAN OUT CLOSETS. Donate gently used items to help others
- DONATE. Google Catholic missions, then choose one mission and how you can help!

FRIENDSHIP WITH JESUS: PARISH MISSION MARCH 11TH – 13TH

"Christianity is not a new philosophy or a new morality. We are only Christians if we encounter Christ." Pope Benedict XVI (3 September, 2008)

The danger for us Christians is that we fall in love with an idea rather than with Jesus. It's so easy to reduce faith to an ethical code or a set of principles. And yet at the heart of Christianity is Christ. It's not enough to know about him, we need to know him. The goal of our faith is ultimately not about knowing things or doing things, but loving him. Our parish mission aims to be a step in the "journey closer to him".

Fr. Peter Zwaans is a priest of the Archdiocese of Adelaide in Australia. He has been a priest for six years after studying in Sydney Australia and the North American College in Rome (where he was a classmate of Father McQuaide). He has undertaken further studies in theology at the John Paul II Institute for Marriage and the Family. He is presently a pastor and vocations director for the Archdiocese.
